

**UNITED NATIONS
MILLENNIUM DEVELOPMENT GOALS**

- 1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger**
 - Reduce by half the proportion of people living on less than a dollar a day
 - Reduce by half the proportion of people who suffer from hunger
- 2. Achieve universal primary education**
 - Ensure that all boys and girls complete a full course of primary schooling
- 3. Promote gender equality and empower women**
 - Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education, preferably by 2005, and at all levels by 2015
- 4. Reduce child mortality**
 - Reduce by two thirds the mortality rate among children under five
- 5. Improve maternal health**
 - Reduce by three quarters the maternal mortality ratio
- 6. Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases**
 - Halt and begin to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDS
 - Halt and begin to reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases
- 7. Ensure environmental sustainability**
 - Integrate the principle of sustainable development into country policies and programmes; reverse loss of environmental resources
 - Reduce by half the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water
 - Achieve significant improvement in lives of at least 100 million slum-dwellers by 2020
- 8. Develop a global partnership for development**
 - Develop further an open trading and financial system that is rule-based, predictable and non-discriminatory. Includes a commitment to good governance, development and poverty reduction – nationally and internationally.
 - Address the least developed countries' special needs. This includes tariff-and quota-free access for their exports; enhanced debt relief for heavily indebted poor countries; cancellation of official bilateral debt; and more generous official development assistance for countries committed to poverty reduction
 - Address the special needs of landlocked and small island developing States
 - Deal comprehensively with developing countries' debt problems through national and international measure to make debt sustainable in the long term
 - In cooperation with the developing countries, develop decent and productive work for youth
 - In cooperation with pharmaceutical companies provide access to affordable essential drugs in developing countries
 - In cooperation with the private sector, make available the benefits of new technologies especially information and communications technologies.

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Every day, the United Nations Information Centre (UNIC) records a 5-minute radio programme aired on the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation (KBC) Radio. The programmes feature news related to the work of the United Nations in Kenya.

The programme has been on air, on weekdays, since January 2006 at 9.15 AM, on the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation's Idhaa ya Taifa (Kiswahili service). Within the first year, two hundred and thirty eight (238) episodes have been aired.

The objective of the daily 5-minute Kiswahili radio programme is to educate the general public on the importance of the Millennium Development Goals and their relevance, and to communicate to the general public the objectivities and activities of the United Nations Agencies operating in the country. The programme is presented by a KBC Senior Radio Producer and Head of Current Affairs, Martin King'asia, and produced by Irene Mwakesi, National Information Officer UNIC.

The broadcast also provides a platform for UN agencies in Kenya to report on their various activities across the country.

The title of the programme and its focus is closely related to the Millennium Declaration and Millennium Development Goals, the challenges to achieve them in Kenya and achievements recorded by UN agencies together with government and donor partners.
